## (Participles; Verb or Participle?) • Practice 1

**Participles** A participle is a form of a verb that acts as an adjective and modifies a noun or pronoun.

Past Participles
A typed report looks neater. Pleased, Kimberly sat down.

**Verb or Participle?** A verb phrase always begins with a helping verb, but a participle acting as an adjective stands by itself.

The crowd was laughing at the street corner clown. The taxpayers were dismayed at the latest increases.	Laughing, the children raced away.  Dismayed, the librarian began to pick up the books.
